**W**hen I first started in my position as Camp Director last fall (September 2019), I was drawn to the theme of finding Jesus in the storm, and being anchored in His love in difficult times. The bible verse I had chosen to use for the following summer camps was **"We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure."** (Hebrews 6:19). Little did I know that 7 months later this theme would become so important to us here at the CSE as we started to navigate through the pandemic, all the while attempting to plan for summer camps.

There were many roadblocks to planning and preparing for summer camps with new procedures coming out and health guidelines changing almost weekly. If we were to run camps, we wanted to ensure that we could do it safely, for the sake of our campers, families, and staff. We also wanted to continue to live out the mission of the CSE, which is to evangelize and to bring Jesus to the youth.

Due to new policies put in place for camps, there were many things we were not able to do this summer. However, it allowed us to think outside the box and to decide to take camps on the road. In total, we were able to have 115 campers participate in our six weeks of camps, which were located in Winnipeg and surrounding areas. It also allowed us to offer camps in the beautiful community of Sagkeeng First Nation!

Bringing camps and ministering to churches, schools and communities in the St Boniface and Winnipeg Dioceses was an incredible opportunity, and also reminded us of the greater community we are a part of as a church.

Our summer was far from perfect, and definitely not what any of us expected, but by the grace of God, we were still able to do something beautiful. We had two incredible teams (French and English) of counselors who rose to the task, and although fewer in numbers, were still able to overcome many challenges. We had a very intense week of training, where we also had to add Covid guidelines to ensure that the teams were all on the same page on how to keep everyone safe this summer. Many games were changed and adapted to ensure a no-contact environment, and physical distancing was encouraged with the help of some 3-foot wide hula hoops, among other new camp guidelines.

Despite the many new rules implemented, the kids still had a lot of fun, and many glory stories were shared with us. Something that parents shared with us was that even though the kids missed out on many of the usual camp activities, the most important part of camps were the friendships and the faith-filled

environment among those friends. As a relational ministry, and as one of our core values, we strive to offer and build up healthy, positive Catholic role models and relationships, and in order to accomplish this, being in each other's presence was very important

to us this summer. We had an incredible summer filled with beautiful testimonies, friendships, happy memories, and a hope in Christ that kept us going through it all, all the while being safe and healthy.

Although we were not able to minister to everyone and our numbers were smaller, we hope that in the future we can continue to invite you and your families to come to camp, and still experience meaningful friendships, faith, and Jesus's love.

We would not have been able to do any of this without the help of all of our donors, supporters and prayer warriors, and so I thank you for your sacrifices, gifts, and prayers, whether big or small, and know that the CSE is always grateful for your generosity and kindness.
