WHATS NEW WITH THE MINISTRIES?

Emmaus

Actively pursuing the answer to the aches of the human heart is at the very core of the Emmaus Young Adults group. Relationship with Christ, understanding the teachings of the Church, and giving witness to the truths that have been revealed to us is how we grow to understand ourselves within the context of God the Father, Son, and Spirit. The Trinitarian community is the source of the absolute goodness that we crave, and on earth, become closest to that Perfection in receiving the Eucharist.



This year of Faith has been a great advantage for the Church to rediscover and become more united Christ. In his letter "Porta Fidei" Pope Benedict XVI says

"The "door of faith" (Acts 14:27) is always open for us, ushering us into the life of communion with God and offering entry into his Church. It is possible to cross that threshold when the word of God is proclaimed and the heart allows itself to be shaped by transforming grace. To enter through that door is to set out on a journey that lasts a lifetime."

Faith is not an ignorance of truth, but the way we embrace truth. Absolute truth, God's logos, the Word is personified in Christ Jesus. To have Faith is both an involvement of the mind and heart.

At Emmaus we have taken this year of faith to heart and mind. Thus far we have looked to the Catechism of the Catholic Church for understanding what Faith is. We have looked to those who have gone before us, the Saints, and looked to their expression of faith, and soon we will enter a series on The Apostles Creed, the profession of faith.

By involving ourselves in this year of faith we are not "patting ourselves on the back" as it were. Looking back to our community's archetype of the Road to Emmaus, we recognize that these travelers were in retreat of Jerusalem in the wake of the events of the Crucifixion. We all, like the travelers on the road, retreat from witnessing to love. Despite our own cowardice we are still loved. Fr. Barron explains it this way:

"Jesus joins them on their journey—though we are told that they are prevented from recognizing him—and he asks them what they are talking about. Throughout his ministry, Jesus associated with sinners. He stood shoulder to shoulder in the muddy waters of the Jordan with those seeking forgiveness through the baptism of John; over and again, he ate and drank with disreputable types, much to the chagrin of the self-righteous; and at the end of his life, he was crucified in between two thieves. Jesus hated sin, but he liked sinners and was consistently willing to move into their world and to engage them on their terms."

Humility needs to be coupled with our call to evangelize. There are those who, consumed by their own frustrations, speak out against a greater society in a manner that does not reflect the self sacrificing altruism that we see in Christ and the Saints. Our fire needs to reflect the burning bush; a flame that glows but does not consume us. It is a flame that's ignited within the depths of our hearts.
